Dear Parent,

Welcome back to the new school year. I wanted to write at the outset of the year ahead to set out our principles and priorities and to describe some of the recent background work that we have been doing in school and throughout the Trust.

The Wellspring Academy Trust is a charity that manages a community of twenty-nine schools that includes Laceyfield Louth. We are acutely conscious of the challenges that the COVID-19 period has presented for everyone. Throughout it we have aimed to support our schools and, in so doing, the communities they serve. We are entering yet another uncertain phase of the pandemic and will endeavour to do everything possible to maintain continuity and safety. We have benefitted enormously from your support and may continue to require it in the weeks and months to come. School leaders will keep you as fully informed of developments as is absolutely possible. Our aim together is to achieve and maintain learning continuity.

To this end, the Trust has invested some £4.5m in its buildings and grounds this summer. Laceyfield Louth itself has benefitted from a £125,000 investment in refurbishment of classrooms, ceilings and lighting and electrical distribution upgrades. This very substantial investment gives a clear indication to you of our commitment to continually improving the quality of facilities available to your child in school and to keeping our buildings safe, warm, welcoming, water-tight and fit for their purpose. A dedicated Trust team of expert professionals has led this crucial work. It is one of the many benefits the school gains from working together in partnership with a community of others in trust.

I sincerely hope that this year is a far more settled and predictable one than we have become used to in recent times. Your school, supported by the Trust, is doing everything that it can to ensure continuous, safe and high-quality provision every day. Some matters are inevitably outside of their – and the Trust’s – control. We will always aim to mitigate the impact, whatever the circumstances. Please continue to support your school and community in every way that you can.
